COVID-19 Update #3 for City of Randleman

Mayor Bucky Jernigan and the Board of Aldermen have declared a state of emergency in the City of Randleman due to the imposed threat by the COVID-19 outbreak. The Declaration went into effect at 7 P.M. on Tuesday, March 17, 2020 and will remain in effect until it is either modified or rescinded.

The Declaration orders all emergency management personnel to cooperate in the enforcement and implementation of the provisions of the Declaration, City ordinances, state and federal laws, and the City of Randleman's Emergency Operations Plan. It also authorizes the City Manager to take the appropriate protective actions to prevent the spread of COVID-19, such as implementing restrictions, modifications, or alterations to any City operations, services, or facilities.

All programs, classes, sport leagues, and other activities facilitated by the Randleman Parks and Recreation Department and Randleman Public Library have been suspended until April 6, 2020. The situation will be reevaluated at that time and an update concerning those activities will be given. Earlier in the week, both the Randleman Public Library and Randleman Community Center had been closed to the public until March 30, 2020. With the Declaration of the State of Emergency in effect, ALL City buildings, including the aforementioned, are closed to the public for non-emergency business until further notice. All staff will continue to work normal operating schedules until further notice, as well. If you have an emergency, please call 9-1-1.

It is recommended that everyone utilizes other means of conducting City business instead of in-person. This includes the drive-thru or drop-box at City Hall, phone, email, postal mail, online, etc. If additional updates are necessary, they will be posted on the City of Randleman's website: www.CityofRandleman.com.

No additional restrictions are in place, other than those listed above, and what Governor Roy Cooper has put into place via Executive Orders. We are taking the necessary precautions to protect our staff, citizens, and community members through limiting non-emergency contact with the public. The plans that will be implemented during the COVID-19 pandemic are to help slow down the spread of the virus as it moves throughout the State of North Carolina so that our healthcare system does not become overwhelmed.
